

# 2016 NORTHEAST DISTRICT CONVENTION WOMEN IN MUSIC SPEAKER Professor Beth Bronk, Texas Lutheran University National Vice President for Professional Relations

Beth Bronk, Associate Professor, is in her tenth year as Director of Bands at Texas Lutheran University, where she teaches conducting, instrumental music education courses, and directs the TLU Bands. Professor Bronk earned her Bachelors degree, Performance Certificate, and teaching certification at the University of Texas at Austin, and Masters degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of North Texas. She is nearing completion of her doctoral work at Teachers College, Columbia University. Her dissertation is titled "Director Expertise in Teaching Intonation." Before joining the faculty at TLU, she completed eighteen years of public school teaching and administration, primarily in the New Braunfels Independent School District. She continues to serve the Texas Music Educators Association as the president of Region 12 and is currently the Vice-President for Professional Relations on the National Council of Tau Beta Sigma. Her inservice presentations and clinics focus on continuing professional growth and education for band directors at all levels of experience. In December, Prof. Bronk was given TLU's 2015-2016 Distinguished Faculty Award for Service and Leadership. Ms. Bronk is an active clinician, adjudicator, and performer

At times, Sponsors are honorary members of the fraternity or sorority that have had no affiliation with the organization prior to accepting the role as Chapter Sponsor. They may not be familiar with the national or local policy, or chapter history. This can create a great deal of distance between the chapter and the Sponsor. This workshop will discuss understanding the Chapter Sponsor's role in the chapter and in chapter operations, how the sponsor fits into the chapter culture, what the chapter's expectations of the Sponsor are and vice versa, and how to strengthen the communication between the chapter, Director of Bands, and Chapter Sponsor.

#### Digital Identity: How Your Online Profiles and Actions Can Affect You

Sir Francis Bacon wrote, "ipsa scientia potestas est," meaning knowledge itself is power. As we work, live, and play in today's world, each of us leaves traces of knowledge regarding ourselves in various digital forms. Because we share so much information about ourselves during the course of so many different types of activities and transactions, we can become forget the importance of maintaining some control over the presentation and uses of this information. This workshop will focus on issues and trade-offs to consider when developing online profiles within our control, such as our social media presences. We will also discuss how our online profiles can be used by others as potential avenues to harm us, our organizations, and our employers. Finally, we will talk about how to address serious forms of cyber-abuse, including doxing, revenge porn, and other forms of harassment.

The workshop will begin by establishing the ground rules for our discussion and ensuring that all participants feel safe and comfortable with the discussion of these topics. The workshop will highlight ways to prevent and address particular forms of harassment, and it will not seek participant input regarding personal experiences that could prompt feelings of vulnerability or exposure.

#### **Implementing Music in Your Chapter**




